

Josephus (in 100 AD) refers to children of Seth building the Pyramid of Giza before the flood

The Jews up to the Saviour's time had a cherished tradition that this Pyramid was built before the flood. Josephus, the learned scribe, gives it as historic fact that Seth and his immediate descendants "were the inventors of that peculiar sort of wisdom which is concerned with the heavenly bodies and their order. And that their inventions might not be lost before they were sufficiently known, upon Adam's prediction that the world was to be destroyed, they made two pillars, the one of brick, the other of stone. They inscribed their discoveries on them both, that in case the pillar of brick should be destroyed by the flood, the pillar of stone might remain and exhibit these discoveries to mankind.

Josephus was accessing documents in the temple; a huge number were destroyed. Did not the Jews have access to documents lost to us.

- **The "Corrected" Torah Scroll:** The Temple held the *Sefer Azarah*—the ultimate master copy of the Torah from which all other official copies across the empire had to be verified. Its destruction led to minor textual variations across different regional diaspora communities.

3. What Josephus Rescued

Josephus himself managed to save a fraction of this lost library. Because he surrendered to the Romans and became an advisor to the future Emperor Titus, he was granted a personal favour during the sack of the city.

Josephus wrote that Titus permitted him to take whatever he wanted from the ruins of his homeland. He chose to rescue **the sacred books of the Temple** and several private family libraries.

When Josephus wrote his history of the world ([The Antiquities of the Jews](#)), he was sitting in Rome utilizing these rescued, salvaged documents. This is exactly why his books contain incredibly detailed histories, king lists, and narratives—including the story of the Children of Seth—that do not appear anywhere in our modern Bible. He was reading from the final surviving volumes of a destroyed civilization.
